It is 11.5 per cent higher than March 2023 collection number of $₹ 1.60-\mathrm{lakh}$ crore. <br> This is the second all-time high collectionafter $₹ 1.87$-lakh crore in April last year. The collections in March are associated with goods consumed and services availed in February.As March typically involves fiscal year-end clearance, collections in Apriltend to be notablyhigh. Since the inception of GST, April has consistently recorded ded record-breaking collections. <br> The Finance Ministry highlighted that FY24 marksamilestone with total gross GST collection of $₹ 20.18$-lakh crore, an 11.7 per cent increase compared with the previous year.
